

VISA & VACCINATION

VISA-WITH-REFERENCE

Visa and Vaccination It is mandatory for all the MTCP participants to follow the Visa With Reference (VWR) application procedure. Once the approval is obtained, the training institution should send a copy of VDR approval letter to the participants. Subsequently, with the copy of the approval, the participants may get the VDR from the nearest Embassy of Malaysia. Wherever applicable, participants are advised to arrange for vaccination on their own prior to travel to Malaysia.

Expenditures on all visa-related fees, airport tax/airport user's charge, transit insurance, excess luggage, travel tax, transit fees, domestic passenger terminal fees, phone charges, private purchases, etc borne by the participants.

VACCINATION FOR YELLOW FEVER

Participants from some countries are required to take a **mandatory vaccination for yellow fever at least 10 days prior to their departure to Malaysia**. Yellow Fever certificate is required to be produced upon landing in Malaysia for countries as listed at the link below: <http://www.imi.gov.my/index.php/en/main-services/visa/visa-requirement-by-country.html>

MEDICAL AND DENTAL TREATMENT

Expenses for medical and dental treatment in government hospitals/ clinics shall be borne by the Government of Malaysia. In case of admission of government hospitals, participants will be eligible for First Class Wards (two bedded or more). Dental treatment is restricted to extraction and filling only. Candidates should be certified medically fit to participate under this programme.

PROCEDURE FOR APPLICATION

Applications should be made using the prescribed MTCP forms available at https://mtcpcoms.kln.gov.my/mtcpcoms/online/list_courses. MTCP application forms can also be obtained at nearest Malaysian Embassies in recipient countries.

All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or National Focal/Aid Coordinator Agency in the respective countries (the relevant ministry or agency responsible for the overall coordination of international technical assistance) and should be submitted ONLY through the diplomatic channel via Embassy of Malaysia in the respective countries.

Submitted application forms must be accompanied by the applicant's:

- ♣ Copy of Passport
- ♣ Passport sized coloured photo (3.5cm x 5cm)
- ♣ Medical Report

Only successful applicants will be notified.

MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME

Background

Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was first initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Regional Meeting (CHOGRM) in New Delhi, India, to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

In line with the spirit of South-South Cooperation, Malaysia through MTCP shares its development experiences and expertise with other developing countries. The MTCP was first formulated based on the belief that the development of a country depends on the quality of its human resources. The programme forms part of the commitment of the Malaysian Government towards the promotion of technical cooperation among developing countries, strengthening of regional and sub-regional cooperation, as well as nurturing collective self-reliance among developing countries.

The MTCP emphasizes the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which are essential for a country's development such as agriculture, economy, finance and trade, education, environment, industrial technical training, diplomacy, public management and administration, professional services, social development and science, technology and ICT. Annually, MTCP collaborates with its leading training institutions to conduct capacity building programmes in various key areas development. Since its inception in 1980, more than 33,000 participants from 144 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.

The Objectives of MTCP are:

- § To share development experiences with other countries;
- § To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries;
- § To promote South-South Cooperation; and
- § To promote technical cooperation among developing countries.

FELLOWSHIP

TERMS AND CONDITION OF THE MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME (MTCP)

ELIGIBILITY OF APPLICANT

- Engineers with more than 5 years experience from local authorities or engineering organizations in such countries.
- To be from government agencies and institutions related to flood management and stormwater management.
- To have undergone tertiary education of at least post school certificate or basic university education
- Have a good command of spoken and written English.
- To be certified medically fit to participate in the course.
- Age between 26-50 years old.

MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

Participant will be given daily allowance or RM 85 (USD26) to cover daily meals and laundry. However, if meals are provided by the institution, the subsistence allowance will not be fully provided. The amount received is depending on the Institution.

If food and lodging are not available at the Training Institution, accommodation for participants at other appropriate places will be arranged by the training institutions.

FARES

A return air ticket from the capital city of the MTCP recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants. Expenditures such as visa and transit fees as well as excess baggage fees are borne by the participants.

TUITION FEES

Tuition fees will be borne by the Malaysian Government.
