

ABOUT MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) initiated at the first Commonwealth Heads of Government Regional Meeting (CHOGRM) for Asia Pacific Region in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGRM in the New Delhi to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC). In line with the spirit of South-South Cooperation, Malaysia through the MTCP shares its development experiences and expertise with other developing countries. The MTCP was first formulated based on the quality of its human resources.

Annually, MTCP collaborates with its leading Training Institutions to conduct more than 50 capacity building programmes in various key areas of development. Since its inception in 1980, more than 33,000 participants from 144 countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under MTCP. ABOUT THE COURSE

Many city councils are actively participating in the discourse, planning and implementation of digital solutions to their cities. This course is offered to those who are concerned about the plan and development of digital and smart cities in their own localities or cities, and yet, would like to get experiences from some potential success stories (or case studies) in digital cities planning, implementation and development. This course aims to introduce different knowledge models of digital cities planning, development, measurement and sustainability for the needs of city folks of various age levels or group of users reside in the cities. The course will specifically emphasise on the lifelong learning and knowledge model for social and people centric cities development and sustainability, as well as introducing crucial technology methods and solutions for some cities services.

TARGETED PARTICIPANTS

A candidate is eligible for admission only if he/she meets the following requirements:

- Must not be more than 45 years of age (Middle to Senior Level).
- Government personnel who are involved in cities related divisions.
- City council planners, leaders or managers for digital cities organisations / corporations / technology providers, educators and researchers
- This course will be conducted in English, therefore, participants must possess an appropriate level of proficiency in English, written as well as spoken.
- Comply with other general requirements of Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP).

MTCP application forms can also be obtained at nearest Malaysian Embassies in recipient countries. All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or National Focal/Aid Coordinator Agency in the respective countries (the

relevant ministry or agency responsible for the overall coordination of international technical assistance) and should be submitted ONLY through the diplomatic channel via Embassy of Malaysia in the respective countries. Incomplete and/or unendorsed forms will not be processed.

Submitted application forms must be accompanied by the applicant's:

- ♣ Copy of Passport
- ♣ Passport sized coloured photo (3.5cm x 5cm)
- ♣ Medical Report

Air-Fare

A return air ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on excursion economy class is provided for participants.

NOTIFICATION

Only successful applicants will be notified of their acceptance to the course by Multimedia University (MMU).

GENERAL CONDITION OF PARTICIPATION

Visa and Vaccination

Training Institutions will apply for Visa with Reference (VWR) and upon approval, a copy will be forwarded to the participants who will subsequently need to collect their respective VDR from the nearest Malaysian mission's. Participants must bear all expenses on medical check-up, vaccinations(whenever applicable) and all visa-related fees, airport-tax/airport user's charge, transit insurance, excess luggage, travel tax, transit fees, domestic passenger terminal fees, phone charges, private purchase, etc.

Manners

Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP participants and abide by the laws, rules and regulations of the land and institutions.

Dress Code

During lectures, male participants are required to dress in long-sleeved shirts with ties, long pants and lounge suits and female participants should be appropriately dressed in office attire. For formal occasions-lounge suit or national costume are required.

Accommodation and Subsistence Allowance

Accommodation and daily subsistence allowance are as follows:

- Participants will be accommodated either in hostel belong to the training institutions or nearby hotel on Twin Sharing Basis.
- Participants will be given daily allowance of RM85.
- However, if meals are provided by the organizer, some portion of the allowance shall be deducted. The amount received varies depending on the training institute.

Tuition Fees

All tuition fees will be borne by the Malaysian Government under the MTCP.

Medical and Dental Treatment

Participants should be certified medically and physically fit to participate in this programme. In case of emergencies and need of medical treatment, medical expenses at a government hospital will be borne by the Government of Malaysia. Dental treatment is restricted to only extraction and filling. Medical expenses at private clinics shall be borne by the participants.

Terms and condition covered by the MTCP for international participants:

- Participants shall follow the programme approved for them. Request for change of the programme will not be entertained. Participants should fully participate in all activities related to the programme.
- Participants are NOT allowed in any political and/or commercial activities in any capacity whatsoever. Participants shall not to take up paid employment during the tenure of course duration or serve as the staff of their Diplomatic Missions in Malaysia.
- Participants are NOT allowed to bring along their spouse or families for the duration of the course. Participants will be required to return to their own

countries upon completion of the course or at the end of the tenure whichever is earlier.

- The participation may be terminated at any time due to unsatisfactory conduct, breach of the conditions of the course, failure to make satisfactory progress or as necessary by Malaysian training institution with the approval of the MTCP Secretariat.
- Participants who are found to be medically unfit during the course of the programme will be required to return to their country.
