This situation creates greater health vulnerability for those who are at greater risk of disease but not under the cover of social protection, such as workers in the informal economy.

## INTERNATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMMES 2017-18

### AIRPORT PICK UP

- All the participants are required to send their flight information (flight No., date and time of arrival at New Delhi Airport ) well in advance to arrange their airport pickup. A person with name play card will receive you at airport, Gate No. 4, terminal 3. The participants are requested that they should not EXIT from any other gate. Participants are requested to make note of it. In case of any problem, kindly contact the Institute's Travel Agency, viz. Mr. Nand Kumar M: 9811333930. In case you don't receive any response from the Travel Agency, you can also contact Institute's Transport coordinating officer Shri V.K. Sharma (M: 9213102817) or Mr. H. S. Rawat, Administrative Officer (9911361290 ).
- Delayed information may cause you inconveniences and you may have to arrange your own transportation from airport to this institute at your own cost. The Indira Gandhi International airport, Delhi is around 40 kilometers from the Institute. In case the participants require, they can avail pre paid taxi from the Delhi airport. The approximate fare would be Rs. 1000/- to Rs. 1200/-. The participants should contact Institute Hostel Reception while making payment for taxi on their arrival.

### HOW TO APPLY

- International Training programmes are sponsored by Ministry of External Affairs, Govt. of India. All the expenses with regard to training i.e. to & fro air travel, tuition fee, accommodation, living allowance, etc. are funded by Govt. of India. The participants would also be provided reference/course books recommended by the Institute.
- **These programmes are exclusively for Foreign Nationals only.** The nominations for each programme are processed by Indian Missions in respective countries. The foreign participants interested in these programmes, may contact the Indian Mission in their country for nominations. **The Institute do not entertain any direct nominations for these programmes.**
- Applicants are required to submit the prescribed ITEC/SCAAP Form to the nodal/designated Government Department/Agency of candidate's country. Participants are advised to submit their dully filled nomination forms to the Indian

Mission in their respective countries. The Institute does not entertain nominations directly.

- Nodal/designated Department/Agency is, in turn, required to forward the applications to the Embassy/High Commission of India, accredited/concurrently accredited to the nominating country.
- Participants are specially requested to indicate their E-Mail id, telephone and fax numbers in the nomination form.
- For airport reception, flight information may be sent to the Institute well in advance.
- Participants are requested to keep four photo copies of their passport & passport size photo, ticket etc.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- Applications should reach the Embassy/High Commission of India at least **03 months** before the commencement of the Course.
- Upon selection, the Embassy/High Commission of India will inform the nodal/designated Department/Agency of the nominating country and the candidate.
- Selected candidates are required to familiarize themselves fully with the living conditions in India and about the Institute through the Institute's website.
- Decision regarding acceptance of applications/nominations rests solely with the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India.
- For any further information/clarification, applicants are requested to contact the concerned Embassy/High Commission of India.

### **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

- Participants are required to conduct themselves with discipline and abide by rules, regulations and guidelines as stipulated by both the nominating Government and the Government of India.
- Participants are required to complete the training Course.
- Participants are to refrain from engaging in any political activity and/or any form of employment for profit or gain.
- Participants are not allowed to bring along their spouses or families for the duration of the Course.
- Participants are required to return to their countries upon completion of the training Course.



## **ACCOMMODATION:**

The participants will be provided accommodation at the hostel of the Institute in the campus. Single AC rooms with attached bathrooms consisting of modern sanitary fittings with cold and hot water supply are provided to the participants. The size of the room is 12 ft.x15 ft.. The rooms are air-conditioned. Two full size wall mount almirahs are also provided with locking facility in each room.

## **FOOD**

The hostel mess is run by professional and experienced catering agency which can provide Indian, continental, chinese food.

## **FACILITIES PROVIDED IN THE ACCOMMODATION**

In the hostel, we have computer centre with internet facility. Laundry services is also available in the Institute on payment basis.

## **RECREATION AVAILABLE WITH ACCOMMODATION**

All the rooms are provided with colour TV having all major cable channels. The hostel also has a state of art gym room of international standard consisting of Treadmills, Recumbent Bike, Cross Trainer, Shoulder Press, Leg Press Biceps Curl, Multi-Station Gym etc. Dedicated to fitness and good health. The facilities of outdoor and indoor games are also available in the campus.

The Institute has a library in the campus consisting of 60,000 books and also subscribes 260 professional national and international journals. All the participants are provided daily newspapers by the Institute . There is a separate reading room also in the library. There is also computer internet facility in the library. All the participants are allowed to issue books from the library during the training period.

## **CLEANLINESS/HYGIENE**

The hostel housekeeping has been outsource to a professional housekeeping agency, who have experienced and skilled housekeeping staff for housekeeping. The agency has also deputed a qualified housekeeping supervisor. The Asstt. Administrative Officer of the Institute supervises the hostel housekeeping work daily. It is at par with international standard.

## **MEDICAL FACILITY**

Participants selected for training Courses are expected to be medically fit. Government of India will bear medical expenses only in case of medical emergency during their training in India.

The Institute has empanelled a medical Doctor, who visits every Tuesday and Friday in the Institute. He is also available in case of any emergency or immediate medical attention.
